

Admission Policy for the PGP Programme of IIM Jammu
Academic Year 2018-19 (CAT-2017)

Stage-1: Shortlisting based on CAT-2017 percentiles

Candidates will be shortlisted for Stage-2 on the basis of CAT 2017 percentiles as mentioned below:

Stage-2: Expression of Interest

Candidates who meet the percentile criteria mentioned in Stage 1, will be asked to fill an expression of interest (EOI) to be further considered for the admission process. Candidates will be informed about this through the website www.iimj.ac.in Candidates are advised to keep visiting the website for activation of EOI provision. Candidates will also be informed about the EOI provision through SMS sent on their registered mobile number.

Stage-3: Generation of merit list for final selection

Only those candidates who clear Stage-1 percentile cut-offs and who submit EOI as mentioned in Stage-2, will be considered for calculation of their composite score in Stage-3 on the basis of the factors as described in Table 2. Candidates will be offered admission in the order of the merit list based on this composite score.
