IIM Jammu, IIT Jammu, AIIMS Jammu with DICCI holds a National Conference on G20 University Connect:
Priorities, Prospects, and Way Forward for Creating Inclusive and Sustainable Society

<u>26th April 2024, Jammu:</u> Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Jammu, Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Jammu, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Jammu, Dalit Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DICCI), and Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir, J & K Bank organized one day National Conference on India's G20 University Connect: Priorities, Prospects, and Way Forward for Creating Inclusive and Sustainable Society" on 26 April 2023 at the Convention Centre, Jammu.

The essence of India's G20 presidency is embodied in the theme of "One Earth, One Family, One Future", which is conformity with the ancient Sanskrit ethos "Vasudahaiva Kutumbakam". The G20 Presidency of India also marks the beginning of "Amritkaal", leading to the centenary of its Independence towards a prosperous, inclusive, and futuristic society backed by a human-centric approach at its core. The event commenced with the Saraswati Vandana followed by the lighting of the lamp.

Prof. B.S. Sahay, Director, IIM Jammu in his welcome address stated that India's leadership in addressing key issues such as climate change, digitalization, gender equality, and sustainable development will be transformative for itself and the entire world at large. The discussions on key engagement groups in this National Conference hosted by IIM, IIT, AIIMS, and DICCI would act as the voice of the global ecosystem bringing together varied stakeholders on a common platform. He also highlighted that everyone should join hands together to dedicate their lives to the service of the nation and society.

The conference's Guest of Honour, Dr. Arun Kumar Mehta, Chief Secretary, Government of Jammu and Kashmir, spoke about the critical role of sustainability in mitigating climate change. Shri. Manoj Chugh, Former President, Group Public Affairs, Mahindra Group, and Former President, Tech Mahindra Ltd. emphasized the need to focus on literacy in India as a top priority. According to him, Education is the backbone of our society, and literacy is where we need to put our action plan. Shri. Manish Grover, Executive Director (Strategic IS & IS) at Indian Oil Corporation Limited, emphasized digitalization has become a necessity, and it is essential to embrace it to stay competitive and relevant. Dr. Angel Rajan Singh, Additional Professor at AIIMS New Delhi, stated that technology should be used as an enabler to augment our capabilities, not replace them. Dr. B.K. Murthy, General Manager, Projects, NIXI-CSC Data, Center Services Ltd, emphasized the importance of protecting data and maintaining sovereignty during the conference. According to him, a secure and encrypted cloud infrastructure provides end-to-end data protection and sovereignty to users. Dr. Shubham Saran, General Manager, Business Development, at National Internet Exchange of India explained that technology has made remarkable advancements in recent years, and it has transformed the way we live, work, and communicate.

The Third-panel discussion was on the topic of Global Trade and Business Recovery: Challenges and the Way Forward, chaired by Dr. Sharad. K. Saraf, Keynote Speaker and Chairman, BoG, IIT Jammu, with panel members ranging from Shri Kuldeep Raj Wattal, Ex-Chairman, Carpet Export Promotion Council, Shri Khalid Khan, Vice-Chairman, Federation of Indian Export Organization. Shri. Khalid Khan, Vice President, of the Federation of Indian Export Organization, stressed that the new economy is going to take over as the old economy supports and sustains.

The fourth topic of the discussion is NextGen Health and G20 Presidency to be chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Y.K. Gupta, Keynote Speaker, President, AIIMS Jammu with panel members ranging from Prof. (Dr.) Nitin. M. Nagarkar, Director, AIIMS, Raipur, Lt. General (Dr.) Sunil Kant, Medical Superintendent, AIIMS Jammu, Dr. Ajit K. Nagpal, Chairman, BoG, Ritnand Balved Medical Foundation, An Umbrella Organization of Amity Schools of Medicines.

Prof. (Dr) Y. K. Gupta, President, of AIIMS Jammu said that the crux of the next generation is walking toward transplants. Artificial Intelligence has created chip humans. According to him, we need to determine a joint solution and offer it to the people who need it the most Dr. Ajit K. Nagpal, Chairman, BoG, Ritnand Balved Medical Foundation, An Umbrella Organization of Amity Schools of Medicine appreciated the initiatives taken by IIM, IIT, and AIIMS in teaching the youth about stainability. As per him, public policy discussions in India often center on PPP as a means of improving citizens' access to healthcare and the financial system. Prof. (Dr) Nitin M. Nagarkar, Director, AIIMS Raipur appreciated India as it is a powerhouse of medicine of all kinds- Ayurveda and Allopathic. India has the potential to come up with the best medicines. The youth need to be motivated to utilize these resources and provide the world with the best solutions to problems faced by people.

The fifth topic of panel discussion revolves around the topic of University Connect: Enhancing Global Collaboration in Higher Education to be chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Shakti Gupta, Keynote Speaker and Executive Director & CEO, AlIMS Jammu with panel members featuring Prof. B.S. Sahay, Director, IIM Jammu, Prof. Manoj Singh Gaur, Director, IIT Jammu, Prof. Umesh Rai, Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu, Prof. Nilofer Khan, Vice-Chancellor, University of Kashmir, Air Marshal (Dr.) Pawan Kapoor, Retd VSM, Vice-Chairman, Russian Education Commission and Vice-Chancellor, Guyana American University. During the panel discussion, Prof. B. S. Sahay, Director, of IIM Jammu emphasized that in India about 1.3 million students go abroad in 2022, and another 1.5 million will do so in 2023. Therefore, IIMs, IITs, and AIIMS are contemplating opening campuses in other countries. Prof. Manoj Singh Gaur, Director, of IIT Jammu stressed students need to be more adventurous to prove themselves differently. Prof Umesh Rai, Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu, reiterated that our education must connect with the challenges of society. Prof. Nilofer Khan, the Vice-Chancellor, The University of Kashmir, mentioned that COVID time had taught us that it is not necessary for physical interaction as online classes proceed with UGC engaging with foreign campuses and universities. Air Marshal (Dr.) Pawan Kapoor, Retd VSM, Vice-Chairman, Russian Education Commission and Vice-Chancellor, Guyana American University stressed that we need to think globally act locally and be vocal.

Post the five interesting panel discussions, the event was followed by the valedictory ceremony. The valedictory ceremony included addresses by Prof B.S. Sahay, Director, IIM Jammu followed by Dr. Milind. P. Kamble, Chairman, BoG, IIM Jammu.

Chief Guest Shri Jugal Kishore Sharma, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Jammu cited that G20 meetings are being conducted across India and it has been made possible owing to the farsighted vision of Shri Narendra Modi, the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India.
