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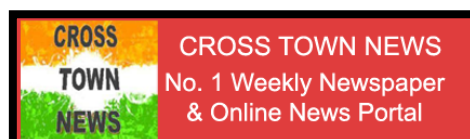

Jammu has the potential to emerge as a distinct Integrated Education Model, says Dr. Jitendra Singh

Jammu, August 28 (Scoop News)- Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh said today that with different kind of higher education institutions coming up within close vicinity of each other and catering to diverse specializations and streams of academics, Jammu has the potential to emerge as a distinct Integrated Education Model, which can also be emulated in other parts of the country.

Speaking as chief guest, during the signing of Multipartite MoU among AIIMS Jammu, IIT Jammu, IIM Jammu and University of Jammu here, the Minister described it as a landmark occasion which is indeed the “Rise of a Rare Quaternary” bringing together Medical Science, Engineering Technology, Management Skills and Varied Specialised Disciplines on the same platform.
